I present my compliments and herewith request the Public Procurement Concession Commission's "**No Objection**" to award contracts to two (2) firms (Sisie Inc & Neosoft Medical Konsults) for the supply and delivery of Medical Equipment to the Ministry of Health with funding from Project 5993.

Kindly be informed that, the Procurement Unit of the Ministry of Health developed Procurement plan for Project 5993, which was approved by the Commission. The Procurement plan contained a line for the supply and delivery of medical equipment using the National Competitive Bidding method.

Howbeit, the procurement process from the level of the Ministry of Health will move forward pending the Commission's No Objection for approval to award contracts to the two (2) most responsive firms for two (2) lots:

Lot one to be awarded to Sisie Inc., which amounts to **Four Hundred Thousand United States Dollars (US\$400,000.00)** and Lot two to Neosoft Medical Konsults which amounts to **Three Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Five Hundred United States Dollars (US\$335,500.00)**.

Honourable Commissioner, the Ministry request for the no objection to award contract to the two firms is in keeping with the Public Procurement and Concession commission act, Reliance: PPCC Act, 2010 Award of Procurement Contract, Section 65(1): *The contract shall be awarded by the Procuring Entity to the bidder that is qualified and submitted the lowest evaluated responsive bid which meets the evaluation criteria as specified in the Request for Quotation*".
