Subj: **REQUEST FOR NO OBJECTION SEEKING REDUCTION IN LEAD TIME FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF ICT EQUIPMENT AND GENERATOR SERVICING PARTS ON THE E-GP SYSTEM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2025**

We present our compliments and acknowledge receipt of your communication requesting the Commission's approval regarding the Liberia Revenue Authority's (LRA) submission referenced above. Following a thorough review of the documentation submitted, the Commission notes the following:

➤ **ICT Equipment:**

The initial procurement process was disrupted due to an unexpected system failure on the LRA platform, which prevented bidders from submitting their proposals within the stipulated timeframe. This interruption rendered the process incomplete and necessitated a request for an adjusted lead time.

➤ **Generator Servicing Parts:**

The Bid Evaluation Panel recommended re-tendering this package after determining that the sole participating bidder did not meet the minimum technical and financial requirements. Consequently, the LRA seeks a reduced lead time to facilitate a timely re-procurement of the requirement.

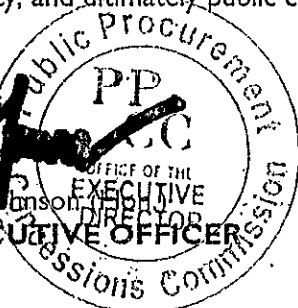
Regulatory Basis:

The LRA's request to re-tender both packages is consistent with **Section 36(2)** of the PPCA, 2010. In view of the foregoing, and considering the need to ensure continuity of operations, timely service delivery, and efficient utilization of the e-GP platform, the Commission hereby approves the LRA's request to reduce the lead time from four (4) weeks to two (2) weeks for both procurement activities, ICT Equipment and Generator Servicing Parts.

The Public Procurement and Concessions Commission admonishes and deems it a priority that you remain compliant with the PPCA, 2010, as we jointly aspire to achieve transparency, accountability, fairness, equality, and ultimately public confidence in our procurement and concessions processes.

Subject: Liberia Revenue Authority Request for Reduction in Lead Time for Procurement Activities on the e-GP System

The Liberia Revenue Authority (LRA) has requested the Commission's "No Objection" to reduce the statutory bid submission lead time to two weeks for the Procurement of ICT Equipment and the Procurement of Generator Servicing Parts. The following supporting document was submitted:

- Transmittal Letter from the LRA.

To ensure conformity with the requirements of the Public Procurement and Concessions Act (PPCA), 2010, and its Amended Regulations, the Commission conducted a review of the request. The key findings are summarized below:

1. ICT Equipment Procurement:
The initial procurement process was disrupted due to an unexpected system failure on the LRA platform, which prevented bidders from submitting their proposals within the original timeline. This disruption rendered the process incomplete and necessitated a request for an adjusted lead time.
2. Generator Servicing Parts Procurement:
The Bid Evaluation Panel recommended a re-tendering of this package after determining that the sole bidder did not meet the minimum technical and financial evaluation criteria. As a result, the LRA seeks a reduced lead time to facilitate a timely re-procurement of the requirement.
3. The LRA request to re-tender the two packages is in accordance with Section 36 (2) of the PPCA 2010.

Recommendation:

In view of the circumstances presented and considering the need to ensure continuity of operations, timely service delivery, and efficient use of the e-GP platform, I recommend that the Commission grants the LRA a two-week reduction in lead time for both procurement activities (ICT Equipment and Generator Servicing Parts) for Fiscal Year 2025.

This recommendation is made with the understanding that all other applicable provisions of the PPCA, 2010, and its Regulations will be strictly adhered to during the conduct of the procurement processes.
