RE: PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF COMPLAINT

The Public Procurement and Concessions Commission (PPCC) hereby notifies bidders that participated in the Grand Cape Mount County Administration procurement process for **Lot #7 – Renovation of the Tewor District Commissioner Compound, Tieni, Grand Cape Mount County**, under **IFB No. MIA/GCMCA/CCDF&SDP/RB/007/2025**, that a Complaint/Request for Review has been filed with the **Complaints, Appeals and Review Panel (CARP)** by **Peace Life Corporation**, with the PPCC in keeping with **Part VIII, Section 129(1)** of the Amended and Restated Public Procurement and Concessions Act, 2026.

In its Complaint, Peace Life Corporation alleges that, following the Bid Evaluation Panel's Report dated February 9, 2026, it was evaluated and recommended as the **“most responsive” bidder** for Lot #7, having met the applicable technical, financial, and eligibility requirements. The Complainant further states that, by Notification of Award dated May 18, 2026, its bid in the amount of **US\$49,044.15** was accepted for Lot #7 and that the Notification of Award stated that it would constitute the formation of contract.

The Complainant further alleges that, after submitting its Conditional Acceptance dated June 30, 2026, it received a communication dated July 2, 2026, from the County Procurement Officer informing it that the Award for Lot #7 had been cancelled for alleged **“administrative reasons”**, with an indication that the same lot was intended to be awarded to another bidder.

Peace Life Corporation avers that the cancellation of the Award after its acceptance constituted a *material procedural irregularity and breach of the applicable public procurement framework*, and further alleges that the action was contrary to the principles of **fairness, transparency, accountability and sanctity of contract** governing public procurement.

The Complainant also contends that it filed a Formal Objection and Demand for Reinstatement dated July 3, 2026, which was received and acknowledged on **July 8, 2026**, but that the Superintendent failed to issue a written decision or response within the period alleged by the Complainant.

In view of the foregoing, Peace Life Corporation has filed this Complaint, praying that the Commission, through CARP, intervenes and investigates the procurement process relating to Lot #7, including the cancellation of the Award, and takes appropriate action in accordance with the Amended and Restated Public Procurement and Concessions Act, 2026. The Complainant further seeks, among other reliefs, the suspension of any further award, contracting or implementation activities concerning Lot #7 and reinstatement of Peace Life Corporation as the successful awardee.

Other participating bidders who may be affected by the resolution of this complaint are requested to file their Notice of Appearance with the Complaints, Appeals and Review Panel (CARP) within **seven (7)** days upon publication of this Notice by the Commission, declaring an interest to appear at the hearing in keeping with **Section 127(9)** of the Amended and Restated Public Procurement and Concessions Act, 2026
