TO: ALL PARTICIPATING BIDDERS, CONTRACTORS, CONSULTANTS, AND INTERESTED STAKEHOLDERS

RE: PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF COMPLAINT

The Public Procurement and Concessions Commission (PPCC) hereby notifies all bidders, contractors, consultants, and other interested stakeholders who participated in the procurement process for the **Supply of Cows** under **Invitation for Bid (IFB No. MOA/PSIP/SBA/NCB/007/2026)** that a Complaint has been filed before the **Complaints, Appeals and Review Panel (CARP)** by **Salvation & Praise Group of Companies (SAP)**, represented by its Chief Executive Officer, **Mr. Success P. O. Johnson**, pursuant to **Part VIII, Sections 126 and 127 of the Public Procurement Act of 2026**. The Complaint alleges violations of the Act arising from the Ministry of Agriculture's procurement process and seeks administrative review by the Commission.

In its Complaint, the Complainant alleges that after participating in the bidding process, it became aware through the PPCC Electronic Government Procurement (e-GP) Platform that the procurement had progressed to the draft contract stage. Consequently, by communication dated **May 26, 2026**, the Complainant requested a debriefing from the Ministry of Agriculture in accordance with the Public Procurement Act, which entitles an unsuccessful bidder to be informed of the reasons for the rejection or non-selection of its bid.

The Complainant further contends that despite its subsequent formal complaint addressed to the Honorable Minister of Agriculture on **June 5, 2026**, neither the Procurement Division nor the Ministry provided the requested debriefing, evaluation findings, or any explanation regarding the rejection or non-selection of its bid.

The Complainant further avers that the continued failure of the Procuring Entity to provide the requested debriefing constitutes a denial of its statutory rights under the Public Procurement Act and is inconsistent with the fundamental procurement principles of transparency, accountability, fairness, equal treatment of bidders, and due process. The Complainant maintains that the Ministry's actions have deprived it of the opportunity to understand the basis of the procurement decision and have undermined confidence in the integrity of the procurement process.

In view of the foregoing allegations, the Complainant has prayed that the Complaints, Appeals and Review Panel (CARP) to:

- i. Conduct an administrative hearing of the procurement process for the **Supply of Cows** under **IFB No. MOA/PSIP/SBA/NCB/007/2026**;

- ii. Determine whether the Ministry of Agriculture violated the provisions of the Public Procurement Act by failing to comply with its statutory obligation to provide a debriefing upon request;
- iii. Review the evaluation and award process to determine whether it was conducted in accordance with the bidding documents and applicable procurement laws; and
- iv. Grant such other relief as the Complaints, Appeals and Review Panel may deem just, equitable, and consistent with the Public Procurement Act of 2026.

Accordingly, all participating bidders, contractors, consultants, and any other persons whose rights or interests may be affected by the determination of this Complaint are hereby requested to file their **Notice of Appearance** with the **Complaints, Appeals and Review Panel (CARP)** within **seven (7) days** from the publication of this Notice, declaring their intention to appear and be heard, in keeping with **Section 127(9) of the Public Procurement Act of 2026**.
