RE: PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF COMPLAINT

The Public Procurement and Concessions Commission (PPCC) hereby notifies bidders that participated in the Ministry of Gender, Children and Social Protection (MOGCSP), procurement package (**IFB.No:MOGCSP/FEWC/GOL/NCB/001/2025**) construction works for the Far East Women Center that a Complaint/Request for Review has been filed with the **Complaints, Appeals and Review Panel (CARP)** by Unico Corporation, Inc., represented by **J. Johnny Momoh & Associates Legal Chambers, Inc.**, with the PPCC in keeping with **Part VIII, Section 125 (1) (a) and (b) of the Amended and Restated Public Procurement and Concessions Act, 2010**.

In its Complaint, **Unico Corporation, Inc.** alleges that although it participated in the bidding process and met all mandatory technical and eligibility requirements, its bid was declared **non-compliant** by the **Bong County Development Officer**, acting on the evaluation of the bid documents forwarded by the Ministry of Gender, on the ground of alleged failure to submit mandatory technical specifications.


The Complainant avers that this determination is **false, misleading, and inconsistent with the bid documents submitted**, and further alleges that the bid-opening and evaluation process was conducted in a manner that was **procedurally flawed**, unfair, and contrary to the Public Procurement and Concessions Act and its governing principles. The Complainant further contends that requests for verification and written confirmation of the alleged deficiencies were not addressed.

In view of the foregoing, **Unico Corporation, Inc.** has filed this Complaint, praying that the Commission, through CARP, **intervenes and investigates the procurement process** to ensure compliance with the Public Procurement and Concessions legal framework and to uphold fairness and transparency in the procurement process.

Other participating bidders who may be affected by the resolution of this complaint, are requested to file their notice of appearance with the Complaint Appeals and Review Panel (CARP) within seven (7) days, upon publication of this Notice by the Commission, declaring an interest to appear at the hearing in keeping with **Section 126(9) of the PPC Act, 2010**.
